Living Sacrifices...

Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

- As a Christian, one of God's greatest desires is for you to know His will for your life. According to our scripture the entire process begins with our willingness to surrender to the power of the Holy Spirit and the Word of God. This is not an easy task since we have both a carnal man and spiritual man living within us. So how can we overcome our old nature? We must first begin each new day by offering our minds and bodies as living sacrifices before the Lord. Secondly, we must spend time reading, praying, and studying the Word of God filling our minds with spiritual truths that will transform us. Thirdly, we must "prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" in our daily walk.
- As living sacrifices we must live our lives in such a way that our behavior and actions manifest a testimony that brings glory to God. The Bible teaches us that "obedience is better than sacrifice." With that in mind, I can assure you we will never be obedient without sacrifice.
 Philippians 2:8 "And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." Jesus defined Himself as the ultimate living sacrifice when He said of His own life, "No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again."
- We live in a time of conformity: a time when many believers take a casual and convenient approach to their relationship and responsibilities to God. A time when many are no longer committed to the work of the Lord. In the last book of the Old Testament, Malachi the prophet said the priests of his day were guilty of offering polluted bread upon the altar of the Lord. They were also offering animals that were blind, crippled, and diseased. In the Old Testament, the sacrificial animal was dead before being offered: unable to escape or walk away. Therein lies the challenge before us as living sacrifices; without a transformed mind, the flesh will have the propensity to get up and walk away.

Ascension Blessings

<u>DID YOU KNOW</u>—that Thursday, May 10th is the anniversary of Christ's ascension into Heaven? Can't you



just picture Him rising slowly heavenward as His disciples looked on in awe and amazement? Surely many of God's children have often wished they could have seen Jesus as the disciples did both before and after His resurrection. How the disciples must have felt when they saw Him ascend and disappear from their view!

We seem to give little thought to what the ascension of our Lord means for us today. In fact, it signifies three great spiritual truths. First, it tells us that the Savior is seated at God's right hand as our Advocate—not as a lowly suppliant on a footstool, but as a crowned prince on a throne. Second, it assures us that He, as the exalted Head of the church, is in charge of the universe. He governs and rules in the affairs of men for the benefit of His people, and He imparts to His own the blessings He procured for us on the

cross. Third, it reminds us that He is in Glory today in a resurrected body like the one we shall receive someday.

Our Savior went up to Heaven while His apostles watched intently, and the Bible records that event for our instruction and comfort (Acts 1:6-11). Isn't it a blessing to know He ascended to His Father and is interceding for us at the Father's right hand?

Recipe for Broccoli Bread (Jean Hinkle) submitted by Frankie Workman

1 loaf frozen bread dough (thaw in fridge overnight) we use the recipe for pizza dough, makes 2 breads

1/2 box frozen broccoli (spears or florets)1/2 pkg. sliced pepperoni (or 3 slices of ham)

3 slices provolone cheese

1/2 pkg. grated mozzarella cheese (4 oz.) or 3 slices 1/2 pkg. grated Colby cheese (4 oz.) or 3 slices

1/4 cup parmesan cheese



Roll out dough to form a 14" circle. Defrost broccoli and chop if using spears. Lay provolone on dough. Next, add pepperoni or ham, mozzarella, broccoli, Colby, and top with parmesan. Bring sides and ends of pastry up to the top and pinch to seal. Bake 25 minutes at 350 degrees. Let stand 5 minutes before slicing. This bread can be used as an appetizer or as a main dish served with a fresh garden salad.
